Getting Started

Insert SIM Card

To insert the SIM Card:

- 1. Switch off the mobile phone and remove the rear cover and battery.
- 2. Insert the SIM card(s) correctly in the card slot(s) as shown below.



Finally, insert the battery and place back the rear cover of the mobile phone.

Insert Memory Card

To insert the memory card:

- 1. Switch off the mobile phone and remove the rear cover and battery.
- Open the memory card slot, and insert the memory card into the slot as shown in the diagram:



Note: Use only compatible memory cards approved by Micromax with this device. Incompatible cards may damage the card and the device and corrupt data stored on the card

Using the Touch Screen

You can use the touch screen in the following ways:

On most screens, the orientation of the screen changes as you rotate it. You can turn this feature on and off

Customize Home Screen

You can add applications, shortcuts, widgets, and other items to any part of the Home screen or change the wallpaper.

- Enter apps screen, long press and hold an application till the screen vibrates, and then release your finger hold.
- Long press and hold the widget or icon you want to move. Once the device vibrates, don't release your hold on the icon. Drag the widget or icon to a new location on the screen.

Manage Notifications

Your notification icons inform you of new messages and events.

When you receive a notification, its icon appears in the status bar. Drag the status bar down from the top of the screen as shown below.



The Notifications panel displays your network provider name and a list of your current notifications.

Drag the tab at the bottom of the Notifications panel to the top of the screen. Or just press the back button. The panel also closes when you touch a notification to respond to it.

Toolkits

At the top of the notification panel are the Toolkit icons. Slide to access and choose various tools available on your handset.



Using Your Phone

Switch On/Off

In standby mode, press and hold the Power key to open phone options. Next, press the Power off option that appears on the display.

Unlock the Phone

To lock, short press the power key.

To unlock the phone, do one of the following:

- Press and hold the Power key. The LCD shows up a slider with a lock.
- Slide the lock icon to unlock icon to unlock the phone.
- If the phone lock has been activated, you need to enter the password to unlock.
- You can also unlock using Pattern or PIN (if enabled).

Make a Call

Touch the icon to enter your desired number and press the // icon on the dialer pad that displays.

Touch the icon and press the **Contacts** icon to access the desired number. Touch the desired contact and then press to make the call.

Answer/Reject a Call

- To answer a call, slide the phone icon to the right.
- To reject a call, slide the phone icon to the left.

Make an International Call

- In dialing mode, press and hold the 0 key, until the + sign appears on the screen.
- Enter the desired international code and then the complete phone number and make the call.

In Call Options

- Touch the Add Call icon to add another person to the call.
- Touch the Mute icon to mute your voice so that the phone's MIC will not transmit voice to the other end. You can resume transmitting your voice by pressing the Mute icon again.
- If Bluetooth device is connected, then tap the Bluetooth option to transmit voice to Bluetooth devices.
- During a conference call, go to Manage Conference icon to split the calls.

- When a call is active and another is on hold tap the Merge Call icon to merge the calls.
- Touch the **Speaker** icon to listen via the speaker.
- End the call by pressing the End icon.

Listen to Music

Menu > Music

You will be presented with the list of available songs to play. You can listen to music by tapping the required icons.

Send Messages

Menu > Messages

You can compose a new message or reply to existing messages in the list. You can also send and receive multimedia messages or reply to existing messages in the list

Add Contacts to Phonebook

- Dial a number and click on 'Add to Contacts'.
- You can either create a new contact or can add the number to existing contacts.
- You can also add contacts from messages, call logs etc.

Browse the Internet

- 1. Tap the Search key.
- 2. Enter the web address and click 'Go'.

Note: To browse the Internet, your Internet settings need to be configured first. You can refer to the Frequently Asked Questions section of the User Guide.

Transfer Data via USB

- Connect the phone with the PC/laptop using the USB cable supplied with this device.
- Drag the notification header downwards (on the top portion of the LCD, tap and drag down your finger).
- 3. Tap USB Storage

The file dialog will open on your PC for file transfer between the PC and Phone.

Note: Memory card should be inserted for data storage.

Using my A27 as a Modem for Internet Connectivity

You can use your A27 as a modem and connect your PC or laptop to the Internet when required. You can do this via:

- USB Tethering
- Wi-Fi Hotspot

Connectivity via USB Tethering

You need to insert an internet enabled SIM card in your phone.

- 1. Connect your A27 to your computer through the USB cable.
- Go to Settings> Wireless & networks> Tethering & portable hotspot > USB Tethering.

The driver installation window will pop up on your PC or laptop.

3. Install the driver as suggested.

You can now start using the Internet service via your A27.

Note: Your mobile operator will charge you based on your GPRS data usage.

Connectivity via Wi-Fi Hotspot

You need to insert a Data Service enabled SIM card on your phone to use your A27 as a router.

- 1. Go to Settings> Wireless & networks>Tethering & Portable hotspot
- 2. Configure your Wi-Fi hotspot.

Make sure your computer has Wi-Fi. After connecting to the Wireless network, you can use the GPRS service from your A27.

Note: Your mobile operator will charge you based on your GPRS data usage.

Other Notable Features

Capture Photos and Videos

Menu > Camera

Use the slider that displays to shift between camera and video mode.

Features:

- 0.3 Megapixel with 8x Zoom (Camera mode)
- White Balance/ Scene mode(Camera mode)

Video format/White Balance/Color effect (Video mode)

Use Voice Command

Menu > Voice Search

Use voice commands to access useful features.

- 1. Tap the Voice Search icon.
- 2. Issue your desired voice command to the phone.

Use the Pinch Zoom Feature

You can open any image or web page and then use your thumb and index finger to zoom the display through the pinch gesture as illustrated below.



Synchronize Contacts List

Settings> Accounts & sync

- 1. Either Add Account or use existing account.
- 2. Select the type of account from the options listed.
- 3. Enter your e-mail ID and Password and tap Next.

 Enter/edit the domain/username and server if required for corporate account.

Choose the account options that display and tap Next.

5. Follow the suggested steps.

Your contacts synchronization will be complete in a few seconds.

To auto-sync an existing account:

- 1. Tap on an existing account.
- Tap either Sync Calendar or Sync Contacts. (All phone contacts will be copied to that email account with details).

For this feature to work, you need to have Internet connectivity via your SIM or Wi-Fi. If your Sync does not proceed as expected, check whether data option is set to ON.

Record Sound

Go to **Sound Recorder**. Press the icon to start/pause recording.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. How can I activate Silent Mode?

Settings >Sound> User Profile> Silent

You can also choose General, Silent, Meeting, or Outdoor modes.

2. How can set up Internet connectivity?

- Go to Settings > Wireless & Networks > Mobile Networks > SIM1/SIM2>
 Access Point Names.
- 2. Next, select the network profile to which you are subscribed.
- 3. Follow the steps as suggested.

3. How can I connect to Wi-Fi networks?

Settings > Wireless & Networks > WLAN Settings

From the **Wireless & Networks** option, you can also configure and enable Bluetooth, VPN and mobile networks.

4. I want to compose and send emails

- 1. Go to Menu > Email.
- 2. Enter the recipient email address.
- 3. Touch Add Cc/Bcc to address a CC or blind copy of the message.
- 4. Enter the subject and body the text of the message.
- 5. Press the Menu key to send attachment with the message.
- 6. Press Send.
