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

2 Getting Started

Installing the SIM Cards and the Battery

You can install up to two SIM cards in the phone at the same time. When installing a SIM card, ensure that the gold contact area faces down, and that the beveled edge of the SIM card aligns with that of the SIM card slot.



Removing the Battery and the SIM Cards

Before removing the battery and the SIM cards, ensure that your phone is powered off.



Installing the microSD Card



Before installing or removing a microSD card, power the phone off. When the phone is powered back on, it indicates whether the microSD card has been installed correctly.

You can expand your phone's memory capacity by installing a microSD card. When installing a microSD card, ensure that the gold contact area faces down.







Charging the Battery

- Connect the small end of the USB cable to the phone's charger jack and the large end to the charger.
- 2. Connect the charger to a power socket.
- Wait until the battery is completely charged.
 During the charging process, the charging icon is displayed in animation. When the charging icon becomes static, the battery is fully charged.
- Unplug the charger from the power socket and the USB cable from the phone.

Navigating the Main Menu

1. In standby mode, press \square to access the main menu.

2. Press to scroll to the desired application and press
(OK) or \square to access the application.
3. Press or to scroll to the desired option, and press
(OK) or to access the option.
4. Press (Back) to return to the previous menu, or press
to return to standby mode.
Phone Lock
The phone lock protects your phone from unauthorized use. By default, the phone lock is disabled. Once the phone lock is enabled, you must enter the phone unlock code each time you power on the phone. The preset phone unlock code is 1234 . You can change this code into any numeric string between four and eight digits. If you forget the phone unlock code, contact your service provider.
PIN and PUK
The personal identification number (PIN) protects your SIM card from unauthorized use. The PIN unblocking key (PUK) unlocks a blocked PIN. Both the PIN and the PIK are provided with the SIM card. For details, contact your service provider. To enable the PIN lock:
 Press and select Settings > Security settings > SIM1 or SIM2
security > PIN lock.
2. Enter the PIN and press (OK) or .
If you enter the incorrect PIN a specified number of times, the phone
prompts you to enter the PUK.

If you enter the incorrect PUK a specified number of times, the SIM card will become permanently invalid. If this occurs, contact your service provider for a new SIM card.

Locking and Unlocking the Keypad



upwards or downwards in standby

mode. To unlock the keypad, slide in the opposite direction.

If the **Auto keypad lock** function is enabled and the phone is in standby mode for a preset period, the phone automatically locks the keypad.





My Files

My Files manages multimedia files stored on the phone and its microSD card. Using My Files, you can view the size and create date of images or audio clips, and open multimedia files.

3 Voice Services

Dual-Card Management

Your phone supports dual-card dual-standby mode, but the two SIM cards cannot be used simultaneously. When you are making a call or using data services with one SIM card, the other SIM card becomes

unavailable, that is, no incoming calls can be received and the data services cannot be used.

Making a Call

- 1. In standby mode, enter the phone number.
- To make an international call, press twice to enter the plus sign (+). Then enter the country or region code, area code, and phone number.
- To call an extension number, enter the phone number, press
 three times to enter **P**, and enter the extension number.
- 2 Press to dial the number.
 - B Press to end the call
 - You can also make a call from the call logs, contacts, or messaging screen.
 - During a call, you can press volume key to adjust the in-call volume.

Answering a Call

When there is an incoming call, you can:

- Press to answer the call.
- Press to reject or end the call.
- Press (Options) and select Answer to answer the call.
 - Press (Mute) to mute the speaker, and press (Reject) again to reject the call.

if the Arry Key answer function is enabled, you can press any key
other than and to answer a call.
SOS
You can access SOS in any mode by pushing upwards. After the alarm goes off for 13 senconds, the phone will automatically send a message to the first number contained in your relative number list. The default message will display the following: Please help me, SOS automatically sent. After the message is sent, the phone automatically salts the relative's number. If the first number cannot be reached, the phone will dial the next number in your relative number list. The phone will continue to dial numbers in your relative number list sequentially until a call is connected. Dush the SOS key upwards and the phone generates an alarm. The alarm will last for 13 seconds, but can be stopped at any time manually.
Name 1/2
In standby mode, press the Name 1 or Name 2 key and press the select Relative Call Number > Add > Enter number / Add from contact. After selecting the desired number, press to save the settings. To set Relative Call Number, press and select Care Assistant > Relative Call > Relative Call Number > Add > Enter number / Add from contact.

4 Text Input

Entering a Word

- To enter a word in multi-tap input mode, press the keys labeled with the letters that spell the word repeatedly until the desired letters are entered.
- To enter a word in predictive input mode:

- 1. Press each key once according to the spelling sequence of the desired word.
- The phone displays words associated with the sequence entered.
- 2. Press the navigation keys to scroll to the desired word.
- 3. Press to enter the word.

Entering a Digit

In number input mode, press the number key labeled with the desired digit.

Entering a Symbol

- 1. Press to display the symbol list.
- 2. Press to scroll to the desired symbol.
- 3. Press \square to enter the symbol.

5 Messages

Writing and Sending a Text Message

- 1. Press and select Messages > Write message > SMS.
- 2. Write the message.
- Press (Options), select Send to, and enter the recipient's phone number or add a recipient from Contacts.
 To add multiple recipients, repeat this step.
- Scroll to the desired recipient and press (Options) for the following options:

- Send: sends the message to the recipient.
- Edit recipient: allows you to change the recipient.
- **Remove recipient**: removes the recipient of the message.
- Remove all recipients: removes all recipients of the message.
- Save to Drafts: saves the message to Drafts.

Writing and Sending a Multimedia Message

- Press and select Messages > Write message > MMS.
- Edit the content of the message. You can add images, audio clips, and attachments to the message. You can also preview the message, add slides to the message, and set the playing interval between two slides.
- 3. Press (Options), select Send to, and enter the recipient's phone number or add a recipient from Contacts. To add multiple recipients, repeat this step.
- 4. Scroll to the desired recipient and press the following options:

- Send: sends the message to the recipient.
- Send options: allows you to set the sending options.
- Edit recipient: allows you to change the recipient.
- Remove recipient: removes the recipient of the message.

- Save to Drafts: saves the message to Drafts.

Warnings and Precautions

This section contains important information pertaining to the operating instructions of your device. It also contains information about how to use the device safely. Read this information carefully before using your device.

Flectronic Device

Power off your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device when using the device causes danger or interference with electronic devices.

Medical Device

- Follow rules and regulations set forth by hospitals and health care facilities. Do not use your device when using the device is prohibited.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm be maintained between a device and a pacemaker to prevent potential interference with the pacemaker. If you are

using a pacemaker, use the device on the opposite side of the pacemaker and do not carry the device in your front pocket.

Potentially Explosive Atmosphere

Power off your device in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere, and comply with all signs and instructions. Areas that may have potentially explosive atmospheres include the areas where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine. Triggering of sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or a fire. resulting in bodily injuries or even deaths. Do not power on your device at refueling points such as service stations. Comply with restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots, storage. and distribution areas, and chemical plants. In addition, adhere to restrictions in areas where blasting operations are in progress. Traffic Security

Observe local laws and regulations while using the device. In addition, if using the device while driving a vehicle, comply with the following guidelines:

- Do not talk on the device while driving. Use hands-free accessories.
- When you have to make or answer a call, park the vehicle at the road side before using your device.

- In a motor vehicle, do not place the device over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. Otherwise, the device may hurt you owing to the strong force when the air bag inflates.
- Do not use your device while flying in an aircraft. Power off your
 device before boarding an aircraft. Using wireless devices in an
 aircraft may cause danger to the operation of the aircraft and
 disrupt the wireless telephone network. It may also be considered
 illeaal.

Operating Environment

- Do not use or charge the device in dusty, damp, and dirty places or places with magnetic fields. Otherwise, it may result in a malfunction of the circuit.
- The device complies with the RF specifications when the device is used near your ear or at a distance of 1.5 cm from your body. Ensure that the device accessories such as a device case and a device holster are not composed of metal components. Keep your device 1.5 cm away from your body to meet the requirement earlier mentioned.
- On a stormy day with thunder, do not use your device when it is being charged, to prevent any danger caused by lightning.
- When you are on a call, do not touch the antenna. Touching the antenna affects the call quality and results in increase in power consumption. As a result, the talk time and the standby time are reduced.
- While using the device, observe the local laws and regulations, and respect others' privacy and legal rights.
- Keep the ambient temperature between 0°C and 40°C while the device is being charged. Keep the ambient temperature between 0°C to 40°C for using the device powered by a battery.

Prevention of Hearing Damage

Using a headset at high volume can damage your hearing. To reduce the risk of damage to hearing, lower the headset volume to a safe and comfortable level.

Safety of Children

Comply with all precautions with regard to children's safety. Letting the child play with your device or its accessories, which may include parts that can be detached from the device, may be dangerous, as it may present a choking hazard. Ensure that small children are kept away from the device and accessories.

Accessories

Use the accessories delivered only by the manufacturer. Using accessories of other manufacturers or vendors with this device model may invalidate any approval or warranty applicable to the device, result in the non-operation of the device, and cause danger.

Battery and Charger

- Unplug the charger from the electrical plug and the device when not in use.
- The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times before it eventually wears out. When the standby time and the talk time are shorter than the normal time, replace the battery.
- Use the AC power supply defined in the specifications of the charger. An improper power voltage may cause a fire or a malfunction of the charger.
- Do not connect two poles of the battery with conductors, such as metal materials, keys, or jewelries. Otherwise, the battery may be short-circuited and may cause injuries and burns on your body.
- Do not disassemble the battery or solder the battery poles.
 Otherwise, it may lead to electrolyte leakage, overheating, fire, or explosion.

- If battery electrolyte leaks out, ensure that the electrolyte does not touch your skin and eyes. When the electrolyte touches your skin or splashes into your eyes, wash your eyes with clean water immediately and consult a doctor.
- If there is a case of battery deformation, color change, or abnormal heating while you charge or store the battery, remove the battery immediately and stop using it. Otherwise, it may lead to battery leakage, overheating, explosion, or fire.

Cleaning and Maintenance

- Do not place your device, battery, and charger in places where they can get damaged because of collision. Otherwise, it may lead to battery leakage, device malfunction, overheating, fire, or explosion.

Certification Information (SAR)

This device meets guidelines for exposure to radio waves.

Your device is a low-power radio transmitter and receiver. As recommended by international guidelines, the device is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves. These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organization International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP) and include safety measures designed to ensure safety for all users, regardless of age and health.

The Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) is the unit of measurement for the amount of radio frequency energy absorbed by the body when using a device. The SAR value is determined at the highest certified power level in laboratory conditions, but the actual SAR level of the device when being operated can be well below the value. This is because the device is designed to use the minimum power required to reach the network.

The SAR limit adopted by USA and Canada is 1.6 watts/kilogram (W/kg) averaged over one gram of tissue. The highest SAR value reported to the FCC and IC for this device type when tested for use at the ear is 0.518 W/kg, and when properly worn on the body is 0.515 W/kg.
