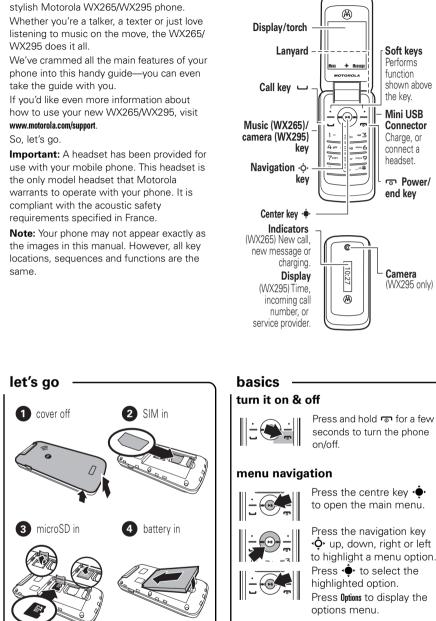

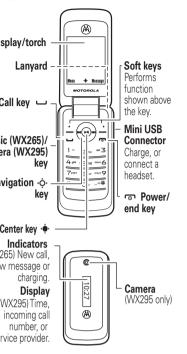

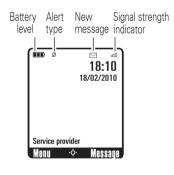

# Battery use & safety

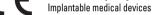

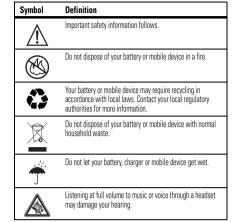
