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Getting Started _

Installing the microSDHC Card

You have the option to install a microSDHC card of up to 32 GB to expand your phone's storage capacity. The microSDHC card can be installed and removed while the phone is turned on. Unmount the microSDHC card before removing it.

1. Place your finger in the slot at the bottom of the back cover to lift and remove the cover.



Hold your microSDHC card with the metal contacts facing down and slide it into the microSDHC card slot until you hear a click.



NOTE: Some applications may require a microSDHC card to work normally or may store certain data on it. Therefore, it is recommended that you keep a microSDHC card installed and not remove or replace it randomly.

3. Press the cover gently back into place until you hear a click.

Charging the Battery

When you first get your new phone you'll need to charge the battery. If the battery is low, there will be a pop-up message on the screen. As you charge your phone, the screen will tell you the exact battery level each time you wake up your phone.

WARNING! Use only ZTE-approved chargers and cables. The use of unapproved accessories could damage your phone or cause the battery to explode.

 Connect the adapter to the charging port. Ensure that the adapter is inserted with the correct orientation.
 Do not force the connector into the charging port.



- 2. Connect the charger to a standard AC wall outlet. If the phone is on, you'll see a charging icon, such as
- 3. Disconnect the charger when the battery is fully charged.

NOTE: If the battery is extremely low, you may be unable to power on the phone even when it is being charged. In this case, try again after charging the phone for at least 10 minutes. Contact customer service if

you still cannot power on the phone after prolonged charging.

Extending the Battery Life

Active applications, screen brightness levels, *Bluetooth* and Wi-Fi usage, and GPS functionality can drain your battery. You can follow the helpful tips below to conserve your battery power:

- · Reduce the screen backlight time.
- · Lower the screen brightness.
- Turn auto-sync, Wi-Fi, and *Bluetooth* off when not in use
- Disable the GPS function when not in use. Most applications using this function will periodically query the GPS satellites for your current location; each query drains your battery.

Powering Your Phone On/Off

- Press and hold the Power/Lock Key to turn on your phone.
- To turn it off, press and hold the Power/Lock Key to open the options menu. Tap Power off and then tap OK.

Setting Up Your Phone for the First Time

When you first power on your phone after you purchase it or reset it to factory settings (see Settings – Personal

- Backup & Reset), you may need to set it up before using it.
- Tap the language field, select the language you want, and tap Start.
- Connect to a Wi-Fi network and tap **Next**. Otherwise, tap **Skip**.
- Set the date, time, and time zone, or use date and time data provided by the network. Then tap Next.
- If you have a Google™ account, tap Existing to sign in. Tap New to create a Google account or tap Not now to set up an account later.
- 5. Configure the Google location options and tap Next.
- 6. Enter your name, which the phone uses to personalize some apps, and then tap.
- You will be prompted to accept the Google terms of service. Tap **Next** to continue.
- 8. Tap **Finish** to complete the setup.

Locking/Unlocking the Screen and Keys

Your phone allows you to quickly lock the screen and keys (put the phone into Sleep mode) when not in use, and also to turn the screen back on and unlock it when you need it.

To lock the screen and keys:

To quickly turn the screen off and lock the keys, press the **Power/Lock Key**.

NOTE: To save battery power, the phone automatically turns off the screen after a certain period of time when you leave it idle. You will still be able to receive messages and calls while the phone screen is off.

To unlock the screen and keys:

- 1. Press the **Power/Lock Key** to turn the screen on.
- 2. Press and hold a blank area of the screen.

NOTE: If you have set an unlock pattern, PIN, or password for your phone (see *Personalizing — Protecting Your Phone With Screen Locks*), you'll need to draw the pattern or enter the PIN/password to unlock your screen.

Using the Touch Screen


Your phone's touch screen lets you control actions through a variety of touch gestures.

- Tap When you want to type using the on-screen keyboard, select on-screen items (such as application and settings icons), or press on-screen buttons, simply tap them with your finger.
- Tap and Hold To open the available options for an item (for example, a message or link in a web page), tap and hold the item.
- Swipe or Slide To swipe or slide means to quickly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen

- Drag To drag, press and hold your finger with some pressure before you start to move your finger.
 While dragging, do not release your finger until you have reached the target position.
- Pinch In some apps (such as Maps, Browser, and Gallery), you can zoom in and out by placing two fingers on the screen at once and pinching them together (to zoom out) or spreading them apart (to zoom in)
- Rotate the screen For most screens, you can automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways.

Getting Started

Getting to Know the Home Screen

The home screen is the starting point for your phone's applications, functions, and menus. You can customize your home screen by adding application icons, shortcuts, folders, widgets, and more. Your home screen extends beyond the initial screen. Swipe the screen left or right to display additional screens.



Personalizing

Changing the System Language

- 1. Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Language & input > Language.
- 2. Select the language you need.

Setting the Date and Time

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Date & time.
- Uncheck **Automatic date & time** and **Automatic time zone** if you want to set the date, time, and time zone by yourself.
- 3. Set the date, time, time zone, and date/time format.

Changing the Ringtone and Notification Sound

You can customize the default ringtone for incoming calls and the default notification sound guickly.

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Sound.
- 2. Tap Phone ringtone or Default notification sound
- 3. Scroll through the list and select the ringtone you'd like to use.
- 4. Tap **OK**.

NOTE: See *People – Editing Contacts – Setting a Ringtone for a Contact* for how to assign a special ringtone to an individual contact.

Turning Touch Sounds On/Off

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Settings** > **Sound**.
- Check or uncheck Touch sounds.

Adjusting Volumes

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Sound > Volumes.
- Drag the sliders to adjust the volume for each type of audio.
- 3. Tap **OK** to save.

NOTE: You can adjust the media volume when a media application is in use by pressing the **Volume Up/Down Key**. If no media application is active, press the **Volume Up/Down Key** to adjust ringtone volume (or the earpiece volume during a call).

Switching to Silent Mode

You can set the phone to silent mode by using one of the following methods:

- Press and hold the Power/Lock Key and then tap

 fo enable silent mode, tap to enable silent
 mode with vibration, or tap to disable silent mode.
- Keep pressing the Volume Down Key when no media application is active. When the cicon appears in the Status Bar, the phone is set to silent mode with vibration. When the cicon appears in the Status Bar, the phone is in silent mode.

Personalizing Personalizing

 Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Sound > Silent mode, and tap Off, Vibrate, or Mute.

Applying New Wallpapers

You can set the wallpaper for the home screen or lock screen.

- 1. Tap and hold any blank area of a home screen.
- 2. Tap Wallpaper.
- Select a wallpaper source from Gallery,
 Wallpapers, Live Wallpapers, or Photos, and
 choose the image or animation you want to use as
 the wallpaper.
- For Gallery images, tap **OK** at the top of the screen.
 For Live or Wallpapers, tap **Set wallpaper**. For Photos. tap **SET WALLPAPER**.

NOTE: Live Wallpapers and **Photos** are not available for the lock screen

Changing the Screen Brightness

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Display > Brightness.
- Tap AUTO to make the phone adjust the screen brightness automatically, or drag the slider to adjust the brightness manually.

Protecting Your Phone With Screen Locks

You can protect your phone by creating a screen lock. When enabled, you need to long press the blank area of home screen, draw a pattern or enter a numeric PIN or password to unlock the phone's screen and keys.

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Security.
- 2. Tap Screen lock.
- Tap None, Long press, Pattern, PIN, or Password
 - Tap None to disable screen lock protection.
 - Tap Long press to enable screen lock and allow unlocking with a "tap and hold" gesture. You can unlock the screen by tapping and holding a blank area on the lock screen.
 - Tap Pattern to create a pattern that you must draw to unlock the screen. The first time you do this, a short tutorial about creating an unlock pattern appears. Then you're prompted to draw and redraw your own pattern.
 - Tap PIN or Password to set a numeric PIN or a password that you must enter to unlock the screen.

NOTE: Screen lock options are listed in the approximate order of the strength of their security, starting with **None** and **Long press**, which provide no security. A pattern provides minimal security, although it can be more convenient than the stronger options.

IMPORTANT: If you forget the pattern you set, try five times and tap **Forgot pattern** to sign in to the Google account you have added on the phone and reset the screen lock. You will need an active Internet connection. You can also upgrade the phone software (see Settings – System – About Phone).

Protecting Your Phone With Encryption

You can encrypt all the data on your phone: Google accounts, application data, music and other media, downloaded information, and more. If you do, you must enter a numeric PIN or password each time you power on your phone.

WARNING! Encryption is irreversible. The only way to revert to an unencrypted phone is to perform a factory data reset, which erases all your data.

Encryption provides additional protection in case your phone is stolen, and may be required or recommended in some organizations. Consult your system administrator before turning it on. In many cases the PIN or password you set for encryption is controlled by the system administrator.

Before turning on encryption, prepare as follows:

- Set a lock screen PIN or password.
- Charge the battery.
- Keep the phone connected to the charger.

 Schedule an hour or more for the encryption process.
 You must not interrupt it or you will lose some or all of your data.

When you're ready to turn on encryption:

- 1. Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Security > Encrypt phone.
- 2. Read the information about encryption carefully.

The **Encrypt phone** button is dimmed if your battery is not charged or your phone is not plugged in. If you change your mind about encrypting your phone, press the **Back Key**.

WARNING! If you interrupt the encryption process, you will lose data.

- 3. Tap Encrypt phone.
- 4. Enter your lock screen PIN or password and tap **Next**.
- 5. Tap Encrypt phone again.

The encryption process starts and displays its progress. Encryption can take an hour or more, during which time your phone may restart several times.

When encryption is complete, you'll be prompted to enter your PIN or password.

Subsequently, you must enter your PIN or password each time you power on your phone to decrypt it.

Opening/Closing the Notification Panel

Notifications report the arrival of new messages, calendar events, and alarms, as well as ongoing events. You can open the Notification Panel to view the details of notifications.

- To open the Notification Panel, swipe your finger down from the top of the screen.
- To close the Notification Panel, swipe your finger up from the bottom of the screen or press the Back Key.

Responding to or Removing a Notification

In the Notification Panel, you can respond to a notification or remove the notifications. The Notification Panel also supports expandable notifications that let you perform additional actions right from the notification itself.

- To respond to a notification, tap it.
- To remove a notification, swipe it left or right.
- To remove all notifications, tap in the top right corner.
- Tap and hold a notification and then tap App info to identify the application that created it. To turn off notifications from that application if needed, uncheck Show notifications in the App info screen.
- Most apps that send notifications, such as Gmail, have notification settings that you can adjust.

NOTE: If you turn off notifications for an app, you may miss its important alerts and updates. The notifications of some apps cannot be turned off.

Use Quick Settings

The Quick Settings in the notification panel make it convenient to view or change the most common settings for your phone.

In the Notification Panel, tap at the top of the notifications list to get to the guick settings menu.

- OWNER: Tap to add your personal information.
- BRIGHTNESS: Tap to adjust the screen brightness.
- **SETTINGS:** Tap to go to the settings menu.
- WI-FI: Tap to turn on or off Wi-Fi.
- DATA: Tap to enable or disable data access over the mobile network.
- AUTO ROTATE: Tap to turn on or off the Auto-rotate feature.
- BATTERY: Tap to see the battery information.
- AIRPLANE: Tap to turn on or off the airplane mode.
- BLUETOOTH: Tap to turn on or off Bluetooth.
- LOCATION: Tap to turn on or off the GPS function.
- SOUND: Tap to switch between vibration and sound.
- **SYNC:** Tap to turn on or off account synchronization.
- FLASHLIGHT: Tap to turn on or off the flashlight.

Managing Apps and Widgets

Adding Apps and Widgets

- 1. Tap and hold an empty place on the home screen, and then tap **Widgets** or **Apps**.
- Tap and hold an item and drag it to a home screen thumbnail at the bottom of the screen.

Moving Apps or Widgets

- 1. Tap and hold a widget or app on the home screen.
- 2. Drag it to the place you need.

Removing Apps or Widgets

- 1. Tap and hold a widget or app on the home screen.
- 2. Drag it to Delete to remove it.

Adjusting Widget Size

- 1. Tap and hold a widget on the home screen and then release it.
- 2. An outline appears around the widget. Drag the outline to resize the widget.

NOTE: Not all widgets can be resized.

Organizing With Folders

You can create folders on the home screen and add several shortcuts in a folder

Creating a Folder

1. Tap and hold the app on the home screen you want to add into a folder until Folder appears.

Drag the app to Folder and release it. A new folder will be created and the app is added to the folder

Renaming a Folder

- 1. Tap a folder to open it.
- 2. Tap the folder name field and enter a new name.

Adding Apps to a Folder

- Tap and hold an app and then drag it onto a folder icon.
- 2. Release the app and it will be added into the folder.

Removing Apps from a Folder

- 1. Tap a folder to open it.
- 2. Tap and hold the app you want to remove and then drag it to the home screen.
- Release the app and it will be removed from the folder.

Rearranging the Favorites Tray

The home screen includes a customizable favorites tray at the bottom of all home screens. You can drag apps, folders, and other priority items in or out of the favorites tray for instant access from any home screen.

Removing Items from the Favorites Tray

Tap and hold an item in the favorites tray and drag it out of the tray.

Adding Items to the Favorites Tray

Tap and hold an item on the home screen and drag it into the favorites tray.

If the favorites tray is full, you need to remove an item from the tray.

Entering Text

You can enter text using the on-screen keyboard. Some apps open it automatically. In others, you open it by tapping where you want to type. You can press the **Back Key** to hide the on-screen keyboard.

Google Keyboard

The Google keyboard provides a layout similar to a desktop computer keyboard. Turn the phone sideways and the keyboard will change from portrait to landscape. The landscape keyboard is not supported in all applications.



- Tap the alphabetic keys to enter letters. Tap and hold some specific keys to enter associated accented letters or numbers. For example, to enter è, tap and hold and the available accented letters and number 3 appear. Then slide to choose è.
- Tap to use uppercase. Double-tap to lock uppercase. This key also changes to indicate the current case you are using: for lowercase, for uppercase, and when locked in uppercase.
- Tap to delete the text before the cursor.
- Tap 123 to select numbers and symbols. You can then tap 1 to find more.
- Tap (to enter miniature icons.

Gesture Typing

The Google keyboard supports gesture typing feature. You use this feature to input a word by sliding through the letters.

To enable and use gesture typing:

- Tap Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Language & input.
- 2. Tap = next to Google Keyboard.
- 3. Check Enable gesture typing.
- Move your finger from letter to letter on the keyboard to trace a word without lifting the finger until you reach the end of the word.

NOTES:

- Tap when you want to. If you want to enter a single letter, go ahead and tap.
- Lift your finger at the end of the word. A space is added automatically when you begin to input the next word

Google Voice Typing

Google voice typing uses the Google voice recognition service to convert speech to text. You must have a data connection on a mobile or Wi-Fi network to use it.

- 1. Tap

 to access the voice typing when you are using the Google keyboard.
- 2. When you see the microphone image, speak what you want to type.
- 3. You can continue entering text to keep it or to delete it.

NOTE: Say "comma," "period," "question mark," "exclamation mark," or "exclamation point" to enter punctuation.

Touch Input Settings

Choose the touch input settings by pressing the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Settings** > **Language & input**. In the **KEYBOARD & INPUT METHODS** section, you can set the default input method and choose the settings for input methods.


Editing Text

- Move the insertion point: Tap where you want to type. The cursor blinks in the new position, and a tab appears below it. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- Select text: Tap and hold or double tap within the text. The nearest word highlights, with a tab at each end of the selection. Drag the tabs to change the selection.
- Cut or copy: Select the text you want to manipulate. Then tap or to cut or copy the text to the clipboard.
- Replace text with the clipboard text: Select the text you want to replace. Then tap or PASTE.



Knowing the Basics

 Insert text from the clipboard: Move the cursor to the insertion point and then tap and hold the tab below the cursor. Release your finger and tap PASTE.



Opening and Switching Apps

Opening an App

- 1. Press the Home Key > Apps icon.
- 2. Slide left or right on the screen and tap an app to open it.

Switching Between Recently Opened Apps

- Tap the Recent Apps Key. A list of the names and thumbnails of apps you've recently used opens. If you've been using more apps recently than can fit on the screen, you can scroll the list up and down.
- 2. Tap a thumbnail to open that app.

NOTE: You can swipe a thumbnail sideways to remove it from the list.

Connecting to Networks and Devices

Connecting to Mobile Networks

Control Mobile Data Use

To enable or disable data access:

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Mobile networks.
- Check Data enabled to enable data access over the mobile network. Clear the check box to disable data access.

To enable always-on data access:

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Mobile networks.
- Check Always-on mobile data to allow applications to update data automatically.

NOTE: When you enable this option, more data traffic will be generated for automatic updates of applications data, and your phone will consume more power.

To get data services when roaming:

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Mobile networks.
- 2. Check **Data roaming**.

NOTE: Data roaming may incur significant roaming charges.

Select System Mode

 Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Mobile networks. Tap System select to change the CDMA roaming mode.

Connecting to Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that can provide Internet access at distances of up to 100 meters, depending on the Wi-Fi router and your surroundings.

Turning Wi-Fi On and Connecting to a Wi-Fi Network

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the **Wi-Fi** switch to the **ON** position to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. Tap a network name to connect to it.
- 4. If the network is secured, enter the password and tap **Connect**.

NOTE: Your phone automatically connects to previously used Wi-Fi networks when they are in range.

Getting Notified of Open Networks

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the **Wi-Fi** switch to the **ON** position.
- Tap ■> Advanced.
- Check Network notification.

When Wi-Fi is on, you receive notifications in the Status Bar when your phone detects an open Wi-Fi network. Uncheck the option to turn off notifications.

Connecting to Networks and Devices

Adding a Wi-Fi Network

You can add a Wi-Fi network if the network does not broadcast its name (SSID) or add a Wi-Fi network when you are out of range.

To connect to a secured network, you first need to get the security details from the network's administrator.

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the **Wi-Fi** switch to the **ON** position.
- 3. Tap 👭
- 4. Enter the network SSID (name). If necessary, enter security or other network configuration details.
- 5. Tap Save.

Forgetting a Wi-Fi Network

You can make your phone forget the details of a Wi-Fi network that you added—for example, if you don't want the phone to connect to it automatically or if it is a network that you no longer use.

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the **Wi-Fi** switch to the **ON** position.
- 3. Tap the Wi-Fi network name and then tap Forget.

Connecting to a WPS Network

Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) is a feature that makes it easy to add your phone to the access points which supply WPS.

You can use one of the following methods to connect your phone to a wireless network using WPS.

Method one: WPS button (Recommended)

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the **Wi-Fi** switch to the **ON** position.
- 3. Tap 69.
- Press the WPS button on the wireless router and the access point will recognize your phone and add it to the network.

Method two: PIN

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Slide the **Wi-Fi** switch to the **ON** position.
- Tap
 > WPS Pin Entry.
- 4. The WPS PIN displays on the screen. Enter the PIN into the access point's setup page.

After entering the PIN, your phone automatically finds the access point and configures the connection.

NOTE: For detailed information about the WPS feature of access point, please refer to its documentation.

Adjusting Advanced Wi-Fi Settings

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Tap > Advanced to adjust the following settings.

- Network notification: Get notifications in the Status Bar when Wi-Fi is on and an open network is available
- Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep: Choose whether or not to keep Wi-Fi on in Sleep mode.
- Scanning always available: Let Google's location service and other apps scan for networks, even when Wi-Fi is off.
- Avoid no internet connections: Only use a Wi-Fi network when the Internet connection is good.
- Install certificates: Check the installed certificates
- Wi-Fi optimization: Check to minimize battery usage when Wi-Fi is on.
- MAC address: Check the MAC address.
- IP address: Check the phone's IP address.
- DLNA IP SETTINGS: Check to use DLNA when no DHCP server is available.

Connecting to Bluetooth Devices

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology. Phones or other devices with Bluetooth capabilities can exchange information wirelessly within a distance of about 32 feet (10 meters). The Bluetooth devices must be paired before the communication is performed.

Connecting to Networks and Devices

- 1. Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. Slide the **Bluetooth** switch to the **ON** or **OFF** position.

When *Bluetooth* is on, the icon will appear in the Status Bar

Changing the Device Name

Turning Bluetooth On/Off

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. Slide the **Bluetooth** switch to the **ON** position if *Bluetooth* is off.
- Tap ■> Rename phone.
- 4. Edit the name and tap Rename.

Pairing With Another Bluetooth Device

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. Slide the **Bluetooth** switch to the **ON** position if *Bluetooth* is off.

Your phone automatically scans for and displays the IDs of all available *Bluetooth* devices in range. Tap **SEARCH FOR DEVICES** if you want to scan again.

- 3. Tap the device you want to pair with.
- If necessary, confirm that the Bluetooth passkeys are the same between the two devices and tap Pair. Alternately, enter a Bluetooth passkey and tap Pair.

Connecting to Networks and Devices

Pairing is successfully completed when the other device accepts the connection or the same passkey is entered

NOTE: The *Bluetooth* passkey may be fixed for certain devices, such as headsets and hands-free car kits. You can try entering 0000 or 1234 (the most common passkeys) or refer to the documents for that device.

Sending Data via Bluetooth

- 1. Open the appropriate application and select the file or item you want to share.
- 2. Select the option for sharing via *Bluetooth*. The method may vary by application and data type.
- Tap a Bluetooth device the phone has paired with or wait for it to search for new devices and tap one of them.

Receiving Data via Bluetooth

1. Turn *Bluetooth* on before trying to receive data via *Bluetooth*.

NOTE: If the phone has not been paired with the sending device, you may need to tap **Bluetooth** > **Z752C** in **Settings** to keep the phone detectable through *Bluetooth*.

- 2. Swipe down on the Status Bar and tap
- 3. Tap **Accept** to start receiving the data.

Depending on your storage setting and whether a microSDHC card is installed, received files are stored automatically in a dedicated folder (*Bluetooth*, for instance). You can access them with the File Manager

app. Received contacts (vCard files) are automatically imported to your contact list.

Connecting to Your Computer via USB

You can connect your phone to a computer with a USB cable and transfer music, pictures, and other files in both directions. Your phone stores these files in internal storage or on a removable microSDHC card.

Connecting Your Phone to a Computer via USB

- 1. Connect your phone to the PC with a USB cable.
- 2. Open the Notification Panel and tap (Connected as...).
- 3. Choose one of the following options:
 - Charge only: Charge your phone via USB.
 - Install driver: Select this option when features (Connect to PC software, Media device) are enabled for the first time, or when they're unavailable.
 - Media device (MTP): Transfer media files on Windows[®], or using Android File Transfer on Mac[®].
 - Camera (PTP): Transfer photos using camera software.

Connecting with Windows Media® Player

You can sync music with your phone and your computer installed with Windows Media Player.

- Connect the phone with your computer via USB and choose Media device (MTP).
- 2. Open Windows Media Player and synchronize music files.

Disconnecting Your Phone From the Computer

To disconnect the phone from the computer, simply unplug the USB cable when you're finished.

Removing the microSDHC Card From Your Phone

If you need to remove the microSDHC card while the phone is on, you should unmount it first.

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Storage.
- 2. Scroll down and tap **Unmount SD card** > **OK**.
- The icon appears in the Status Bar and you can now safely remove the microSDHC card from the phone.

Erasing the microSDHC Card

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Storage.
- Scroll down the screen and tap Erase external SD card > Erase SD card > Erase everything.

CAUTION! The formatting procedure erases all the data on the microSDHC card, after which the files CANNOT be retrieved.

Connecting to Virtual Private Networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions to let people access local network resources when not on campus, or when connected to a wireless network

Depending on the type of VPN you are using, you may be required to enter your login credentials or install security certificates before you can connect to your VPN. You can get this information from your network administrator.

NOTE: You need to set a lock screen pattern, PIN, or password before you using credential storage.

Adding a VPN

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > More > VPN.
- 2. Tap **Add VPN profile** and fill in the information provided by your network administrator.
- 3. Tap Save.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN screen

Connecting to a VPN

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > More > VPN.
- 2. Tap the VPN that you want to connect to.

Connecting to Networks and Devices

NOTE: You need to set a lock screen PIN or password before you can use credential storage.

When prompted, enter any requested credentials and then tap Connect.

When you are connected, the VPN connected icon appears in the Status Bar.

Modifying a VPN

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > More > VPN.
- 2. Tap and hold the VPN that you want to modify.
- 3. Tap **Edit profile** and edit the VPN settings.
- 4. Tap Save.

Phone Calls

You can place calls from the Phone app, the People app, or other apps or widgets that display contact information. Wherever you see a phone number, you can usually tao it to dial.

Placing and Ending Calls

Placing a Call by Dialing

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > \square > \square.
- 2. Enter the phone number with the on-screen keypad.

 Tap

 to delete incorrect digits.

NOTE: As you enter digits, your phone searches for contacts that match. If you see the number you want to dial, tap it to place the call immediately without entering the rest of the number.

3. Tap Lelow the keypad to dial.

NOTE: To make an international call, tap and hold the **0 Key** to enter the plus (+) symbol. Next, enter the country code followed by the city/area code and then the phone number.

Ending a Call

During a call, tap End on the screen.

Answering or Rejecting Calls

When you receive a phone call, the Incoming Call screen opens, displaying the Caller ID or the information about the caller that you've entered in People. You can answer or reject the call, or reject it with a text message.

Answering a Call

When you receive a phone call, slide \(\sqrt{o}\) down to answer the call.

NOTE: To silence the ringer before answering the call, press the **Volume Up/Down Key**.

Rejecting a Call

When you receive a phone call, slide \(\sqrt{u} \) up to reject the call.

You can also slide up to reject the call and send a preset text message to the caller.

NOTE: To edit the text response from within the Phone app, tap \equiv > **Settings** > **Quick responses**.

Working With the Call Log

The Call Log is a list of all the calls you've placed, received, or missed. It provides a convenient way to redial a number, return a call, or add a number to your Contacts.

To open the call log, press the **Home Key** $> \square > \square$

Placing a Call from the Call Log

- 1. Open the Call Log.
- 2. Tap a number for more information about the call, or tap \(\subseteq \text{beside} \) beside it to call back.

Phone Calls

Adding a Call Log Number as a Contact

- 1. Open the Call Log.
- 2. Tap a number to view more call information.
- 3. Tap 🕰
- To add the number to an existing contact, tap a contact in the list. To add a new contact, tap **Create** new contact

Taking Other Actions on a Call Log Entry

- 1. Open the Call Log.
- Tap a number to view more call information. While viewing the call details, you can:
 - Tap the number to call it.
 - Tap > Edit number before call to edit the number in the dialer before calling it.

 - If the number belongs to a contact you already have, tap to view contact details.
 - Tap > Remove from call log to delete the call log.

Calling Your Contacts

Calling a Contact

 Press the Home Key > and then tap the All Contacts tab

- 2. Swipe the screen up or down to view all your contacts with phone numbers.
- 3. Tap a contact name to call that contact.

Checking Voicemail

If you have set the phone to divert certain calls to voicemail, callers can leave voicemail messages when they cannot reach you. Here's how to check the messages they left.

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > \square > \square.
- 2. Tap and hold the **1 Key** in the dialer. If prompted, enter your voicemail password.
- 3. Follow the voice prompts to listen to and manage your voicemail messages.

NOTE: To set your voicemail service, tap * > **Settings** > **Voicemail** in the dialer and tap the voicemail settings you want to change. For detailed information, please contact your service provider.

Using Options During a Call

During a call, you will see a number of on-screen options. Tap an option to select it.

- Tap to switch to the keypad when you need to enter a code (for example, the PIN for your voicemail or bank account) during the call.
- Tap 📢 to turn the speaker on or off.
- Tap to mute or unmute the microphone.

- Tap to make another call separately from the first call, which is put on hold.
- Tap to go to your messaging inbox.
- Tap to go to contacts.
- Tap to merge the separate calls into a single conference call.
- Tap to put the caller you are speaking to on hold, and switch to the other call that has been put on hold.
- Tap End to end the current call.

WARNING! Because of higher volume levels, do not place the phone near your ear during speakerphone use.

Managing Multi-party Calls

When the call waiting and three-way call features are available, you can switch between two calls or set up a conference call.

NOTE: The call waiting and three-way call features need network support and may result in additional charges. Please contact your service provider for more information

Switching Between Current Calls

When you're on a call, your phone screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller ID.

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

Tap to answer the call. This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.

To switch between two calls:



Setting Up a Conference Call

With this feature, you can talk to two people at the same time.

- 1. On the dialer screen, enter a number and tap
- Once you have established the connection, tap and dial the second number. This puts the first caller on hold and dials the second number.
- 3. When you're connected to the second party, tap ... If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all callers are disconnected.

To end the conference call, tap End.

Adjusting Your Call Settings

Press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Settings** > **Call settings** to configure the call options.

Phone ringtone	Select the default ringtone for incoming calls.		
Vibrate pattern	Select the vibration pattern for incoming calls.		
Vibrate when ringing	Check this option to enable vibration when the phone is ringing.		
	Service	Select voicemail service provider.

TTY mode	Your phone is a TTY compatible device. A TTY device can allow people who have hearing or speech disabilities to communicate by telephone. Simply connect the TTY device to the phone's headset jack. Select a TTY mode for your phone to work with a TTY device, or turn TTY off.	
Hearing aids	Check this option to turn on hearing aid compatibility.	
DTMF tones	Set the length of dual-tone multi- frequency (DTMF) signal tones.	
Speed dial	Set speed dialing keys.	
Call ended operation tips	Check to use the tips.	
Auto answer	Set to answer incoming calls automatically. You can also set auto answer details, like Call duration and Auto answer conditions.	
Call forwarding	Forward your incoming calls to a different number. And choose when to forward: Always forward, Forward when busy, Forward when unanswered, or Cancel All Forward.	
Additional settings	Voice privacy	Check to enable enhanced privacy mode.

People

You can add contacts on your phone and synchronize them with the contacts in your Google account or other accounts that support contact syncing.

To see your contacts, press the **Home Key** > ... From there, you can tap the tabs to quickly switch to your contact groups ... or favorite contacts ...

Checking Contact Details

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > .
- 2. Scroll through the list to view all your contacts.
- 3. Tap a contact to view its details.

NOTE: If you have a lot of contacts stored, you'll see a slider on the right side of the screen. To go directly to a letter, tap and hold the slider and drag it to a letter.

Adding a New Contact

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > .
- 2. Tap 🚉 to add a new contact.

NOTE: If you have no contacts added yet, tap **Create a new contact**.

- Tap the account field to choose where to save the contact. If a sync account is selected, the contacts will be synced automatically with your account online.
- Enter the contact name, phone numbers, email addresses, and other information.
- 5. Tap **DONE** to save the contact.

Setting Up Your Own Profile

You can create your own name card in your phone.

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > \square > \square .
- 2. Tap **Set up my profile** or your name, whichever is at the top of the contact list.
- 3. Tap Edit.
- 4. Edit your profile information and tap **DONE**.

Importing, Exporting, and Sharing Contacts

You can import/export contacts to/from your phone storage or microSDHC card. This is especially useful when you need to transfer contacts between different devices. You can also quickly share your contacts using *Bluetooth*, Email, Messages, etc.

Importing Contacts From the microSDHC Card or Phone Storage

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > .
- 2. Tap **■** > Import/Export > Import from storage.
- If you have added contact accounts other than the phone, select an account in which to save the contacts.
- 4. Select the vCard file(s) in the microSDHC card or the phone storage and tap **OK**.

NOTE: If the microSDHC card is not installed in the phone, you can import vCard file(s) from the phone storage.

People People

Exporting Contacts to the microSDHC Card or Phone Storage

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > [2].
- 2. Tap > Import/Export > Export to storage.
- 3. The phone will prompt you with the name of the vCard file. Tap **OK** to create the file.

Sharing Contacts

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > 🔝
- Tap > Multi-Select.
- 3. Tap the contacts you want to share to select them and then tap ...
- Choose to share the contacts via Bluetooth, Drive, Email, Gmail, or Messaging.

Working With Favorite Contacts

In the Favorite contacts tab, you can find your favorite contacts and frequently used contacts.

Adding a Contact to Favorites

You can add the contacts used frequently to Favorites so you can find them quickly.

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > 💷 > 🖭
- 2. Tap a contact and then tap next to the contact

Removing a Contact from Favorites

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > 🔼 > 🛣
- 2. Tap a favorite contact and then tap next to the contact name.

Working With Groups

Viewing Your Contact Groups

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > \square > \square .
- 2. Scroll through the list to view the preset groups and any groups you have created.
- 3. Tap a group to view its members.

Setting Up a New Group

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > 💷 > 🕮.
- 2. Tap to create a new group.
- 3. If you have added contact accounts other than the phone, tap to choose an account for the new group.
- 4. Enter a group name.
- 5. Tap **Add member** and select the contacts you wish to be the group members.
- 6. Tap 🗸
- If necessary, tap **Default** below RINGTONE to set a special ringtone for incoming calls from the group members.
- 8. Tap **DONE**.

Deleting a Group

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > 🔼 > 🗪.
- 2. Tap a group and then tap > **Delete**.
- Tap **OK** to delete the group. The contacts in the group will not be deleted.

Editing a Group

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > | > | > |
- 2. Tap a group.
- 3. Tap > Rename group to edit the group name.

 Or tap > Multi-Select to select the members you don't need and remove them.

Searching for a Contact

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > 🔲 > 💽, and then tap 🔍 to search.
- 2. Input the contact name you want to search for. The contacts matched will be listed

Editing Contacts

Editing Contact Details

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > 🔛
- 3. Edit the contact and tap **DONE**.

Setting a Ringtone for a Contact

Assign a special ringtone to a contact, so you know who is calling when you hear the ringtone.

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > .
- 2. Tap a contact you want to set a ringtone for and then tap $\blacksquare >$ **Set ringtone**.
- 3. Select a ringtone you like and tap **OK**.

Deleting a Contact

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > ...
- Tap a contact you want to delete and then tap > Delete.
- 3. Tap **OK** to confirm.

Deleting Several Contacts

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > .
- Tap **■** > Multi-Select.
- 4. Tap **OK** to confirm.

Accounts

Adding or Removing Accounts

You can add multiple Google accounts and Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync® accounts. You may also add other kinds of accounts, depending on the apps installed on your phone.

Adding an Account

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Add account.
- 2. Tap the type of account you want to add.
- Follow the on-screen steps to enter the information about the account. Most accounts require a username and password, but the details may vary. You may also need to obtain some information from IT support or your system administrator.

When the account is successfully added, it is displayed in the **ACCOUNTS** list.

Removing an Account

Removing an account will delete it and all information associated with it from your phone, such as emails and contacts.

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings. In the ACCOUNTS section, tap the account type.
- 2. If you have more than one account of that type, tap the account you'd like to remove.
- 3. Tap > Remove account > Remove account.

Configuring Account Sync

Syncing Manually

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Settings**.
- In the ACCOUNTS section, tap the account category and then the account you want to sync.
- Tap **■** > **Sync now**.

Changing an Account's Sync Settings

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Settings**.
- In the **ACCOUNTS** section, tap the account category and then the account. The Sync settings screen appears, showing a list of information the account can sync.
- Check or uncheck items as you need. Checked types of information on the phone and the web will be kept in sync when auto-sync is turned on.

Email

Press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Email**. Use it to read and send emails from services other than Gmail.

Setting Up the First Email Account

- When you open **Email** for the first time, enter your email address and password.
- 2. Tap **Next** to let the phone retrieve the network parameters automatically.
- **NOTE:** You can also enter these details manually by tapping **Manual setup** or if automatic setup fails
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions to finish setup. Your phone will show the inbox of the email account and start to download email messages.

Checking Your Emails

Your phone can automatically check for new emails at the interval you set when setting up the account.

You can also check new emails manually by tapping in any of the email account's boxes. Tap **Load more** messages at the bottom of the email list to download earlier messages.

Responding to an Email

You can reply to or forward a message that you receive. You can also delete messages and manage them in other ways.

Replying to or Forwarding an Email

- Open the email you want to reply to or forward from the Inbox.
- 2. Choose one of the following:
 - To reply to the sender, tap at the bottom of the screen.
 - To reply to the sender and all recipients of the original message, tap at the bottom of the screen
 - To forward the message, tap at the bottom of the screen.
- 3. Edit your message and tap

Marking an Email as Unread

You can return a read email to the unread state—for example, to remind yourself to read it again later. You can also mark a batch of emails as unread.

- While reading a message, tap > Mark as unread.
- While in a message list (for instance, the inbox), tap the checkboxes before the messages and then tap .

Deleting an Email

You can delete an email from its folder. You can also delete a batch of emails.

- While in a message list (for instance, the inbox), tap the checkboxes in front of the messages and then tap > OK.

Email Email

Writing and Sending an Email

- 1. Open your email Inbox and tap
 - **NOTE:** If you have more than one email account added on the phone, tap the sender line to select the account you want to use for sending the message.
- 2. Enter a contact name or email address in the **To** field. Separate each recipient with a comma. You can also tap **a** to select recipients from your contacts.
- 3. Enter the email subject and compose the email text.
- 4. Tap **■** > **Attach file** to add audio files, images, videos, and other types of files as attachments.
- 5. Tap at the top of the screen to send the message.

Adding a Signature to Your Emails

You can set a few lines of plain text as a signature for every outgoing email message from an account, such as your name and contact information.

- 1. Open the Email app.
- 2. Tap > Settings and select the account you want to add a signature to.
- 3. Tap Signature and enter the text.
- 4. Tap **OK**.

Adding and Editing Email Accounts

Adding an Email Account

After setting up your first email account (see *Email – Setting Up the First Email Account*), you can add more email accounts and manage them separately.

- 1. Open the Email app.
- 2. Tap > **Settings** and tap **ADD ACCOUNT** at the top right of the screen.
- 3. Set up the account as you did with the first one.

Editing an Email Account

You can change a number of settings for an account, including how often you check for email, how you're notified of new emails, and details about the servers the account uses to send and receive emails.

- 1. Open the Email app.
- 2. Tap > **Settings** and tap the account whose settings you want to change.
- Make the changes you want and press the Back Key when you're finished.

Removing an Email Account

- 1. Open the Email app.
- 2. Tap **■** > **Settings** and tap the account you want to remove.
- 3. Tap **Remove account** > **OK**.

Changing General Email Settings

General settings apply to all email accounts you add.

- 1. Open the Email app.
- 2. Tap > Settings > General.
- 3. Make the changes you want and press the **Back Key** when you're finished.

Gmail

After you sign in to your Google account on the phone, you can send and retrieve Gmail messages with the Gmail app.

NOTE: This feature may not be available in certain regions or with certain service providers.

Opening Your Gmail Inbox

Press the **Home Key** > **Google** > **Gmail**. The Inbox screen appears.

If you haven't signed in, you will be prompted to do so or create a new account.

Swipe down on the screen to refresh your inbox and download new messages.

Switching Accounts

Gmail displays conversations, messages, and settings from one Google account at a time. If you have signed in to more than one Google account on your phone, you can switch accounts and view information in each account

- From your Inbox, tap =
- 2. Tap your account name.
- 3. Tap the account you want to see. The account's Inbox will open.

Writing and Sending a Message

Open your Gmail Inbox and switch to the account you want to use for sending the message.

- 2. Tap at the bottom of the screen.
- 3. Enter a contact name or email address in the **To** field. Separate each recipient with a comma.
- 4. Enter the email subject and compose the email text.
- 5. To attach an image, tap .
- 6. Tap at the top of the screen to send the message.

Adding a Signature to Your Gmail Messages

You can set a few lines of plain text as a signature for every outgoing Gmail message. The signature you set on the phone is independent of the signature you use for Gmail on the web.

- 1. Open the Gmail app.
- 2. Tap > Settings and select the account you want to add a signature to.
- 3. Tap **Signature** and enter the text.
- 4. Tap **OK**.

Replying to or Forwarding a Message

- Open the Gmail message you want to reply to or forward to another person.
- 2. Choose one of the following:
 - To reply to the sender, tap in the message header.

- To reply to the sender and all recipients of the original message, tap ...
- To forward the message, tap .
- Tap :> Print to print the message.
- 3. Edit your message and tap

Working With Received Attachments

When a message has an attachment, Gmail displays information about it in the ATTACHMENTS section of the email.

Depending on the attachment type, the applications installed on your phone as well as your settings, you may tap * to preview, view, or save the attachment.

NOTE: For documents with multiple pages, tapping the **Preview** option will only download the pages you view, while tapping other options may download the entire file and cost more time and data.

Working With Labels

Message labels include both labels you create and default labels such as **Sent**, **Starred**, and **Outbox**. You can organize your emails by labeling them or adding stars to them. Labels also help you sort your messages, just like folders.

Adding or Changing a Label

1. Open the Gmail app and tap the sender images next to the messages you want to label.



- 2. Tap 🕻 > Change labels.
- 3. Check or uncheck labels in the new screen and tap **OK**.

Adding Stars to Messages

- 1. Open the Gmail app and tap the sender images next to the messages you want to star.
- 2. Tap **₹** > **Add star**.
- 3. To add a star to just one message, tap $\stackrel{\wedge}{\curvearrowleft}$ beside the message.

Viewing Messages by Label

- 1. Open the Gmail app and tap at the top of the screen.
- 2. Tap a label below **ALL LABELS** to view messages with that label.

Gmail

Changing Gmail Settings

Open the Gmail app and tap > Settings to change General settings, which apply to all Gmail accounts, or other settings that only apply to specific accounts.

Messaging

You can use Messaging to exchange text messages (SMS) and multimedia messages (MMS).

Opening the Messaging Screen

Press the **Home Key** >

The Messaging screen opens where you can create a new message, search for messages, or open an ongoing message thread.

- Tap I to write a new text or multimedia message.
- Tap \(\text{\text{Q}}\) to search for a message using keywords.
- Tap an existing message thread to open the conversation.

Sending a Text Message

- 1. On the Messaging screen, tap 🗹
- 2. Add recipients in one of the following ways:
 - Tap the To field and manually enter the recipient's number or the contact name. If the phone presents a few suggestions, tap the one you want to add.
 - Select recipients from your contacts by tapping .
- Tap the **Type message** field and enter the content of your text message.
- 4. If you want to send a multimedia message, tap to attach a file or a slideshow to the message.
- Tap ➤.

NOTES:

- You can also include email addresses as recipients for multimedia messages.
- Do not add any attachment if you want to send a text message. Otherwise you may be charged for a multimedia message.

Replying to a Message

Messages you receive are appended to existing threads of the same number. If the new message comes from a new number, a new thread is created.

- 1. On the Messaging screen, tap the thread that has the message you want to reply to.
- 2. Type your reply in the text box at the bottom. You can tap if you want to reply with an MMS.
- Tap ➤.

Forwarding a Message

- 1. On the Messaging screen, tap the thread that has the message you want to forward.
- 2. Tap the message.
- 3. Tap **Forward** in the menu that opens.
- 4. Enter a recipient for the message and edit the content if needed.
- 5. Tap ➤.

Messaging

Deleting Messages or Threads

Deleting Messages in a Thread

- 1. On the Messaging screen, tap a thread.
- Tap > Select item(s).
- 3. Tap the messages you want to delete.

Delete Message Threads

- On the **Messaging** screen, tap and hold one thread you want to delete.
- 2. If there are more threads you want to delete, tap them one by one.
- 3. Tap 🛅 > **OK**.

Changing Message Settings

Tap ■ > **Settings** in the Messaging screen to change Message settings.

Calendar

Calendar on the phone works with the web-based Google Calendar™ service for creating and managing events, meetings, and appointments. It also works with the Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync calendar once you sign into your Exchange account on the phone.

To open Calendar, press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Calendar**.

Viewing Your Calendars and **Events**

Selecting Visible Calendars

- 1. Open the Calendar app.
- 2. Tap > Calendars to display.
- In the new screen, tap to check the calendars you want to see or uncheck the calendars you'd like to hide.

Events from hidden calendars are not shown in the Calendar app.

Changing Calendar Views

You can view your calendars in different forms. The app offers four views: **Month**, **Week**, **Day**, or **Agenda** shown at the bottom.

You can also change to Day view from Month view by tapping any day in the grid.



- In Month view, swipe vertically to see earlier months and later months.
- In Week or Day view, swipe horizontally to see earlier weeks/days and later weeks/days.
- When you are viewing earlier or later days, weeks, or months, tap at the top to quickly switch to today.

Viewing Event Details

In Agenda, Day, or Week view, tap an event to view its details.

In Month view, tap a day to switch to Day view. Then tap an event to view its details.

Creating an Event

- 1. In any Calendar view, tap to open an event details screen for a new event
 - You can also tap a spot in Day or Week view twice to add an event to that time spot.
- 2. Add details about the event.

Enter a name, location, time span, and other additional details about the event.

NOTE: If you have more than one calendar, you can choose the calendar to which to add the event by tapping the current calendar above the **Event name** box.

3. Tap **Save** to save the new event.

Calendar

Editing or Deleting an Event

- 1. Find the event you want to edit or delete.
- 2. Open its details screen (see *Viewing Your Calendars* and *Events Viewing Event Details*).
- 3. Choose one of the following options:
 - To edit the event, tap . Tap Save to save your changes.

Changing Calendar Settings

To change Calendar settings, open a Calendar view (Day, Week, Month, or Agenda) and then tap $\P >$ **Settings**.

Google+_

Google+ is a social networking service offered by Google. The Google+ application on your phone enables you to manage your data, chat with online contacts, organize them in different circles, and share your selected information.

Press the **Home Key** > **Google** > **Google**+. The first time you open the Google+ app, select the photo and video backup and contact sync options.

NOTE: For a detailed guide for Google+, open Google+ and tap $\{ \} >$ **Help** to view the online instructions.

Getting Started With Google+

Open the Google+ app and tap **Everything** near the top of the screen to use the following features:

- Everything: Add a suggested person, or see posts people have shared with you, a circle you are in, or everyone.
- My Circles: Find people to add to your Google+ circles, create new circles, or view and organize people into circles based on your relationships. You can also follow content posted by people you find interesting.
- Find communities: Search and join all kinds of online communities, where people gather for the sharing and discussion of a common topic.
- Photos: View photos you uploaded, photos of you, photos from your posts, and more.

- **Locations:** See your friends' locations on the map and configure your location sharing settings.
- Events: Manage your social calendar. You can add events, invite people, and then share photos in real time from the event.

Changing Google+ Settings

To change Google+ settings, open Google+ and tap $\blacksquare >$ **Settings**.

Browser

Use Browser to view web pages and search for information

Opening the Browser

Press the **Home Key** > \subseteq. The last web page you were viewing is displayed. If you have not used Browser recently, your home page opens.

Browser also opens when you tap a web link—for example, in an email or a text message.

Opening a Web Page or Searching the Web

- 1. Open the Browser app.
- Tap the address box at the top of the web page. If the address box isn't visible, swipe down a little to show it.
- 3. Enter the address (URL) of a web page. Or, enter terms you want to search for. You can also tap

 to search by voice.

 to
- 4. Tap a URL or search suggestion or tap **Go** on the keyboard to open the web page or search results.

NOTES:

- Tap at the bottom of the screen if you want to stop opening the page.
- Tap # at the bottom of the screen if you want to open a new page.

Setting the Home Page

Your home page opens when you open a new browser tab, when you start Browser after restarting your phone, or after not using the app for a while.

- 1. Open the page you want to set as your home page.
- 2. Tap > Settings > General > Set homepage.
- 3. Tap **Current page** or one of the following options:
 - Blank page: Open browser tab without opening a web page by default. This can make new Browser tabs open more quickly.
 - **Default page:** Set the factory default URL as the homepage.
 - Most visited sites: Every new browser tab displays a list of your frequently visited sites for you to choose from.
 - Other: Type a URL as the homepage.

Get Information About the Current Page

Tap **=** > **Page info**.

Working With an Opened Page

While viewing most web pages, you can do the following operations:

- Scroll: Swipe the screen in any direction.
- Zoom out: Tap the screen or pinch two fingers together.

- Zoom in: Tap the screen or spread two fingers apart.
- **Go back:** Tap **d** to return to the page you've viewed previously in the same window.
- Go forward: Tap
- Refresh the page: Tap beside the address bar.
- Find text on the page: Tap > Find on page and type the terms you want to search for.
- Send the page URL to friends: Tap > Share page and select how you want to send the URL.
- Follow a link: Tap a link on the web page to open it.
- Save the page for offline reading: Tap Save for offline reading. You can tap Sookmarks > SAVED PAGES to read them.

NOTE: Besides links, Browser also recognizes some phone numbers, addresses, and similar information for you to act on. Try tapping them and see what happens.

Using Multiple Browser Tabs

You can open several web pages at the same time (one page in each tab) and switch between them freely.

Opening a New Browser Tab

Tap at the bottom of the screen. A new browser window opens and the homepage is loaded.

Switching Between Tabs

1. Tap at the bottom of the screen.

- 2. Swipe vertically to scroll through the list of opened tabs.
- 3. Tap the thumbnail of the tab you want to open.

NOTE: Swipe a thumbnail horizontally or tap its **X** to close the tab.

Downloading Files

Tap and hold an image or a link to a file or to another webpage. In the menu that opens, tap **Save image** or **Save link** > **OK**.

The downloaded files are saved to your phone or the memory card. You can view or open them in the Downloads app (**Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Downloads**).

Using Bookmarks

Save web URLs as bookmarks to open them easily in the future.

To open a bookmark, tap **Bookmarks** in a browser tab and then tap the bookmark.

Bookmarking a Web Page

- 1. Open the web page.
- 2. Tap > Save to bookmarks.
- Edit the bookmark label and address if necessary, or choose a different account. Tap the name beside Add to to change the place where the bookmark will be stored.
- 4. Tap **OK**.

Browser

Editing a Bookmark

- 1. Tap > Bookmarks.
- 2. Tap and hold the bookmark.
- 3. Tap Edit bookmark.
- 4. Edit the label, address, account, or location of the bookmark in the dialog that opens.
- Tap **OK**.

NOTE: Preinstalled bookmarks may not be edited.

Deleting a Bookmark

- Tap > Bookmarks.
- 2. Tap and hold the bookmark.
- 3. Tap Delete bookmark.
- 4. Tap **OK**.

NOTE: Preinstalled bookmarks may not be deleted.

Viewing Your Browsing History

- 1. Open the Browser app and tap = > Bookmarks.
- 2. Tap the **HISTORY** tab.
- Tap a time span to view the web pages you browsed during that time. You can tap an item to reopen the web page.

Changing Browser Settings

You can configure a number of Browser settings to customize the way you browse the web, including several that you can use to control your privacy.

To open the Browser settings screen, tap **Settings**.

Google Maps

Activating Location Services

To use Google Maps, and to find your location on Google Maps, you must have location services turned on on your phone.

- 1. Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Settings > Location.
- 2. Slide the **Location** switch to the **ON** position to turn on location access.
- 3. When location access is enabled, tap **Mode** to select location modes you want to use.
 - **High accuracy:** Get accurate location using both GPS and Wi-Fi as well as mobile networks.
 - Battery saving: Use only Wi-Fi and mobile networks to get your approximate location.
 This will drain less power from your battery than using GPS.
 - Device only: Use GPS to pinpoint your location.

Getting Your Location

1. Press the Home Key > Google > Maps.

The map centers on a blue dot and arrow that indicate your location and the direction the phone is facing.

Searching for a Location

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > **Google** > **Maps**.
- 2. Tap the Search field.

NOTE: You can also tap \P beside the search box to use voice search.

- 3. Enter the place you're looking for in the search box at the top. You can enter an address, a city, or a type of business or establishment, for example, "museums in Shanghai." As you enter information, suggestions from your previous searches and from popular searches appear in a list below the search box. You can tap a suggestion to search for it.
- 4. Tap the search icon on the keyboard. Red points indicating search results appear on the map.
- Tap a red point to open a card at the bottom summary information about the location. Slide the card up to find more information about the location as well as options for getting directions and more.

Getting Directions to Your Destination

Maps can provide directions for travel by foot, public transportation, or car.

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > **Google** > **Maps**.
- 2. Tap 🚱
- Select the mode of transportation and then enter a start and end point. If your location is found, it will appear in the start point field by default. As suggested routes appear, tap one to see it on the map. Slide the bottom card up to see the route directions in a list.

NOTE: Tap to use Google Maps Navigation (beta) and get turn-by-turn voice directions.

Google Maps

Searching for Local Places

Google Maps helps you find all kinds of businesses and establishments around you. You can rate these places and get recommendations.

- 1. Press the Home Key > Google > Maps
- 2. Navigate the map view to the area you'd like to explore and tap .
- Swipe left or right under each category to view more options.
- 4. Tap a location for more information.

You can also slide up the bottom card to find out more information, such as the street address, website, and street view, or to call that place, save it to your Google account, or share it with others.

NOTE: This feature is not available for all areas.

Google Now and Search

You can search for information on the web or on your phone using Google Search, get information when you need with Google Now without searching, or perform certain tasks by speaking.

Enabling Google Now

Google Now gets you just the right information at just the right time. It tells you today's weather before you start your day, how much traffic to expect before you leave for work, and more. You can turn Google Now on or off from within the Google app.

- 1. Press and hold the Home Key.
 - The first time you open the Google app, you'll see a brief explanation of how Google Now works. Tap **NEXT** > **YES. I'M IN.**
- 2. Tap ₹ > Settings.
- 3. Slide the ON/OFF switch next to Google Now.

Searching With Text

- 1. Tap the Google Search box at the top of the home screen to start the **Search** app.
- 2. Enter the terms you want to search for and tap question.

Searching by Speaking

- 1. Tap U to the right of the search box, or tap the search box and then say "OK Google".
- Speak the terms you want to search for. When you're finished speaking, your speech is analyzed and the search is initiated.

If Google Search didn't quite understand what you said, you are prompted to repeat your search terms. Tap Ψ or say "OK Google" and repeat your search.

Changing Search and Voice Search Settings

Open the Google app and tap > Settings to set Google Now, notifications, voice and phone search options, and to change privacy settings for your account.

To set Voice Search settings, press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Settings** > **Language & input** > **Voice search**.

Camera

You can take photos and record videos. Photos and videos are stored to the phone's memory card or to the phone's internal storage. You can copy them to your computer or access them in the Gallery app.

Capturing a Photo

- 1. Press the **Home Key** >
- 2. Aim the camera at the subject and make any necessary adjustments.
- 3. Tap 🗖

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Number	Function
1	Switch between the front and the back cameras.
2	Turn flash on/off (only available for the back camera).
3	Select the color effect (only available for the back camera).
4	Change the camera settings.
5	Select scene mode (only available for the back camera).
6	Start/end video recording.
7	Capture a photo.
8	View photos and videos you have captured

WARNING!

Keep a safe distance when using the flash. Do not point the flash towards the eyes of people or animals.

Using Manual Camera Mode

You can use the manual camera mode to adjust more camera options for you photo such as ISO, white balance, exposure, contrast, saturation, sharpness, etc.

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > .
- 2. Tap and select Manual.
- 3. Aim the camera at the subject and you can make the following adjustments.
 - Tap ISO to select ISO level or leave it at Auto.
 - Tap WB to change white balance scenario or leave it at Auto.
 - Tap **1** to adjust the photo exposure.
 - Tap 🔊 to adjust the photo contrast.
 - Tap to adjust the photo saturation.
 - Tap 🚺 to adjust the photo sharpness.
 - Tap lot to hide the camera options.
- 4. Tap **a** to take the photo.

Recording a Video

- 1. Press the **Home Kev** > .
- 2. Aim the camera at the subject and make any necessary adjustments.
- 3. Tap **t** o start and **t** o stop recording.

NOTE: While recording is in progress, you can tap to save the frame as a photo.

Customize Camera Settings

Before taking a photo, you can tap to open the following camera setting options:

	Grid: Show or hide the composition lines.
~	Self-timer: Set a time delay before the camera takes a picture automatically after you tap the shutter icon, or turn off this feature.
	Auto-review: Adjust the review time.
	Picture size: Adjust the picture size.
	Shutter tone: Select your preferred shutter tone.
	Video quality: Set the quality for the video clips.
	Time lapse: Set the time interval between each frame when you shoot time lapse videos.
	Silence camcorder: Check this option if you want to capture silent video clips.
Ф	Geo-tagging: Select whether to store the GPS location in captured pictures or videos.
	Restore defaults: Restore the default camera settings.

Gallery _

Opening the Gallery

Press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Gallery** to view albums of your pictures and videos.

Working With Albums

When you open the Gallery, all pictures and videos on your phone are displayed in a number of albums.

Viewing album contents

Tap an album to view the pictures and videos it contains.

Sharing Albums, Pictures, or Videos

- Tap and hold an item in the Albums view to select an album or after you open an album to select a picture or a video.
- 2. Tap more items that you want to share.
- 3. Tap at the top of the screen and select how you want to share the items

To view details of an item

- 1. Tap and hold an item until it is selected.
- Tap > Details.

Deleting Albums

- 1. Tap and hold an album until it is selected.
- 2. Tap more albums that you want to delete.

Working With Pictures

Tap a picture in an album to view the picture in full screen. Double-tap the picture, or pinch two fingers together or spread them apart to zoom out or in. Slide left or right to view other pictures in the album.



Number	Function
1	Tap to return to the album, where all its contents are displayed in a grid.
2	Delete the picture.
3	Edit the picture.
4	Set the picture as contact icon or wallpaper.
5	Share the picture.
6	View more options.
7	Browse the album contents in a slideshow.

NOTE: Not all the options may be available for certain albums or pictures.

Retouching Your Pictures

You can edit any photos you took and some other pictures in Gallery. The changed picture is saved in the same album as the original one, while the original is never affected.

- 1. While viewing a picture in full screen, tap the screen and tap

 to open the PhotoEditor interface.
- 2. Tap the icons along the bottom of the screen to edit the picture.

FX	Apply style effects such as bleach, blue crush, instant, and more.
	Crop, straighten, mirror, or rotate the picture.
	Adjust exposure, vignette, shadows, sharpness, and more.
	Apply a frame to the picture.
4	Decorate people in the picture with comical moustaches, eye glasses, hats and more.
0	Apply a blur effect to the picture.
	Select a color and draw anything on the picture.
•	Add some text to the picture and adjust its effect.

- 3. To cancel or accept the changes you've made to the picture, tap at the top of the screen.
- 4. Tap **Save** to save the new picture.

Playing Videos

- 1. Tap an album in **Gallery** and then tap the thumbnail of a video.
- 2. Tap at the center to start playing.
- 3. Tap the video to view the playback controls.

Music

Press the **Home Key > Apps icon > Music** to play audio files stored on your phone. Music supports a wide variety of audio formats, so it can play music you purchase from online stores, music you copy from your CD collection, and more.

Copying Music Files to Your Phone

Before using Music, you need to copy audio files from your computer to your phone or memory card.

Copying From a Computer

- Connect your phone and the computer with a USB cable.
- Tap Media device (MTP) (if supported on the PC) or Camera (PTP) to browse the files on the phone storage and the microSDHC card.
- 3. Copy the music file from the PC to the phone storage or microSDHC card.

Downloading From the Internet

You can download music files when browsing web pages (see *Browser – Downloading Files*).

Receiving via Bluetooth

You can receive music files from other devices via Bluetooth (see Connecting to Networks and Devices – Connecting to Bluetooth Devices – Receive Data via Bluetooth).

Viewing Your Music Library

Press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Music** and your music library is displayed. All your audio files are cataloged according to the information stored in the files.

Tap the tabs at the top of the screen to view your music library organized by **Songs**, **Playlists**, **Folders**, **Albums**, **Artists**, or **Genres**. You can also tap **RECENTLY PLAYED** or **FAVORITE** to browse songs you recently played or you have added as favorites.

NOTE: If an audio file is being played, its summary information is displayed at the bottom of the screen. Tap **!!** to open the playback screen.

Setting a Song as the Default Ringtone

The song will be used as the ringtone for all incoming calls, except those from contacts you have assigned special ringtones to (see *People – Editing Contacts – Setting a Ringtone for a Contact*).

- 1. Press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Music** to see the music library.
- 2. Tap next to a song in any list.
- 3. In the menu that opens, tap **Use as ringtone**.
- 4. Tap Phone Ringtone or Notification Ringtone.

NOTE: If the song is being played, you can tap **!** > **Use as ringtone** in the playback screen.

Playing Music

Tap a song in the music library to listen to it. The following playback screen appears:

Managing Playlists

Create playlists to organize your music files into sets of songs, so that you can play the songs you like in the order you prefer.

- Tap <a> > Add to playlist next to a song to add it to a playlist or create a new playlist.
- Tap > Delete Playlist next to a playlist to delete the playlist.
- Tap Sename Playlist next to a playlist to rename the playlist.
- Tap a playlist to view its content. You can tap > Multi Select to select the song you want to remove.

Play Music

The Play Music app works with Google Music, Google's online music store and streaming service. You can stream via mobile data or Wi-Fi and listen to your favorite songs that you've added to your online Google Music library. You can also play audio files you've copied directly to your phone from a computer.

NOTE: The availability of Google Music is dependent on your region. If it is not available, or you don't have a mobile data or Wi-Fi connection, you can only play music stored on your phone.

Playing Your Music

 Press the Home Key > Google > Play Music. If you are prompted, select an account to access its online music library.

The app searches your online library and your phone for music and playlists before displaying your recent activity. Tap > My Library to view your library, which is organized by GENRES, ARTISTS, ALBUMS, and SONGS. Tap > Playlists to view existing playlists.

Tap a song to play it. When the song is playing, tap the summary information at the bottom to display the playback screen.



Number	Function
1	Song and artist information. Tap or drag down to return to the music library.
2	Album artwork.
3	Give the song a thumbs up.
4	Playback control. Skip songs, pause and resume playback, use shuffle or repeat. Drag the progress bar to jump to any part of the song.
5	Give the song a thumbs down.
6	View more options.
7	View the current playlist (queue).

You can still control the music when you are not in the playback screen.

- In the Play Music app, tap the summary information at the bottom of the screen to restore the playback screen
- In other apps, swipe down on the Notification Panel.
 Tap the song title to restore the playback screen, or just pause/resume playback or skip to the next/ previous song.
- When the screen is locked, the song information and playback controls are displayed on top of the screen.
 You can pause/resume playback or skip songs.

Managing Playlists

Create playlists to organize your music files into sets of songs so that you can play the songs you like in the order you prefer. To view all your playlists, tap Playlists.

- Tap > Add to playlist next to a song or a playlist to add it to a playlist or create a new playlist.
- Tap > Delete > OK next to a playlist to delete the playlist.
- Tap a playlist to view its content. You can tap > Remove from playlist next to the song you want to remove, or drag _____ to the left of each song to rearrange its order in the playlist.

Video Player

Use the Video Player to play various kinds of videos.

Opening the Video Library

Press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Video Player** to view your video library.

Playing and Controlling Videos

- Tap a video in the video library to play it. Rotate the phone on its side to watch the video in landscape view.
- Tap the video to show the playback controls. You can pause and resume the playback or jump to any part of the video, hide the control panel and more.

Managing Video Files

Deleting Videos

- 1. Tap and hold a video in the video library.
- 2. To remove more videos, tap them.
- 3. Tap at the bottom left of the screen.
- 4. Tap **OK**.

Sharing Videos

- 1. Tap and hold a video in the video library.
- 2. To share more videos, tap them.
- 3. Tap at the bottom right of the screen and select how you want to share them.

Renaming a Video

- 1. Tap <a> next to the video you want to rename.
- 2. Tap Rename.
- 3. Type the new video name and tap **OK**.

Viewing Details of a Video

- 1. Tap next to a video you want to view the details of.
- 2. Tap Details.

Sound Recorder

Sound Recorder enables you to record voice memos and listen to them whenever you like.

Recording a Voice Memo

- 1. Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Sound Recorder
- 2. Tap to start recording. Tap > OK to cancel recording. Tap to pause and to continue recording.
- 3. Tap to stop recording. The memo is automatically saved

Playing a Voice Memo

Playing a Memo You Just Recorded

Tap at the bottom of the screen.

Playing Any Saved Memo

- Tap at the top right of the screen to see all recordings.
- 2. Tap the title of a memo to play it.

NOTE: You can also tap
at the right of the memo to delete, share, rename, tag, trim it, check its file information, or set it as your phone ringtone.

More Apps

Clock

Set alarms or turn the phone into a bedside clock.

Setting a New Alarm

- 1. Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Clock.
- 2. Tap a default alarm to configure it, or tap 4 at the bottom of the screen to create a new alarm.
- 3. Set up the alarm options, such as time, repeat, alarm sound and label
- 4. Tap Save to save and exit.

Using the Bed Clock

The Bed Clock displays the current time and the next alarm.

- 1. Press the Home Key > Apps icon > Clock.
- If necessary, tap > Bed clock preferences in the Alarm screen to set up the Bed Clock options. Then press the Back Key to return to the Alarm screen.
 - Enable bed clock: Turn on or off the Bed Clock function.
 - Bed clock never sleeps: Keep the Bed Clock screen turned on when charging the phone.
- 3. Tap > **Bed clock** to open the Bed Clock screen.

Stopwatch and Countdown

 Countdown allows you to set a time and count down to zero, while Stopwatch allows you to record lan times

World Time

- Tap in Clock to check local time for cities around the world.
- 2. Tap \blacksquare at the bottom to add a new city.

Calculator

Press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Calculator**. **NOTES:**

- Turn the phone to landscape to view more calculator options.
- Tap **Tip** to access the tip calculator.

Chrome

Use Google Chrome to browse the Internet. Chrome on your phone can sync bookmarks, browsing history, and opened tabs from your Google account.

Downloads

The Downloads app keeps a record of the files you have downloaded using the Browser, Email, or Gmail app.

Press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Downloads** to check the record.

• Tap a file to open it with the appropriate applications.

 Tap and hold a file, or check the box in front of it, to delete or share it.

File Manager

Quickly access all of your images, videos, audio clips, and other types of files on your phone and on the memory card.

- Press the Home Key > Apps icon >
 File Manager. The folders are organized by
 category, phone storage and the memory card
 storage.
- Tap folders and files to access stored items.
- Tap **Phone/SD card** > **to** create a new folder in the current directory.

Note

Press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Note** to save and view your text notes.

- Tap a category of note, and tap to create a new note. Then enter your text and tap Save to save it.
- Tap a note to view its entire content. You can also edit it, delete it, share it, export it, or move it to a notebook.

Play Books

Press the **Home Key** > **Google** > **Play Books** to read ebooks purchased from the Play Store.

Tap > My Library to view your book library. Tap a book cover to read it.

• Tap > **Shop** to buy more books from the Play Store. Tap 1 to search by book title or author name.

Play Movies & TV

Press the **Home Key** > **Google** > **Play Movies & TV** to watch movies you rent from Play Store as well as your personal videos stored on the phone.

 Tap > My Movies or My TV Shows to view your movies or TV shows. You can stream them for online watching or download them to watch offline.

Task Manager

Press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **Task Manager** to view or stop applications.

- Tap a task in the **Tasks** tab to switch to its screen, force stop it, or see its details.
- Tap the Apps tab to manage all the apps on your phone.
- Tap the **Resources** tab to view the real-time system resources information.

YouTube

Press the **Home Key** > **Apps icon** > **YouTube**. You can watch YouTube videos or upload your own.

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Play Store

Press the **Home Key** > .You can buy or rent music, books, movies, and apps and download them to your phone.

NOTE: The content you can access in Play Store depends on your region and your service provider.

Browsing and Searching Apps

You can browse apps by category and sort them in different ways. Tap a top-level category, such as Games, and tap the app from any subcategory.

You can also search for apps using an app's name or description, or the developer's name. Just tap \bigcirc and enter the search terms.

Downloading and Installing Apps

When you find the app you are interested in through browsing or searching, tap it to open its details screen, where more information about the app is displayed.

 Tap INSTALL (free apps) or the price (paid apps) in the app details screen. If the app is not free, you will need to sign in to your Google Wallet™ account and select a payment method.

CAUTION: Once installed, some apps can access many functions or a significant amount of your personal data. The Play Store will show you what the app can access. Tap **ACCEPT** to accept the permissions for the app or tap the **Back Key** to

- cancel. Your app will start downloading immediately or once payment is successfully authorized.
- The app is successfully installed when appears in the status bar. You can find the new app after pressing the Home Key > Apps icon.

Creating a Google Wallet Account

You must have a Google Wallet account associated with your Google Account to purchase items from the Google Play Store app.

Do one of the following:

- On your computer, go to checkout.google.com to create a Google Wallet account.
- The first time you use your phone to buy an item from Play Store, you're prompted to enter your billing information to set up a Google Wallet account.

WARNING!

Requesting a Refund for a Paid App

If you change your mind, you can install the app again, but you can't request a refund a second time. For details, please read the Play Store help information.

- 3. Tap the app to uninstall for a refund. The details screen for the app opens.
- Tap REFUND and then tap UNINSTALL. Your app is uninstalled and the charge is cancelled.

Managing Your Downloads

Accounts

Manage your accounts and synchronization. Tap **Add account** to sign in to or create accounts on your phone.

Tap an account type to see that type of accounts you have added and adjust the accounts' settings.

System

Accessibility

Configure the system accessibility options and accessibility plug-ins on your phone, such as using **Talk Back** for low-vision users

Printing

Configure cloud printing service options, manage print jobs and more.

Software Update

You can check your system's software version, check for updates, continue update, or check the profile.

About Phone

View phone status, legal information and other information. Meanwhile, you can also update your phone software through storage card updates.

Radio Frequency (RF) Energy

This model phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.

This phone is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government:

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kg. *Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

Distraction

Driving

Full attention must be given to driving at all times in order to reduce the risk of an accident. Use only approved accessories. Do not connect with incompatible products or accessories. Take care not to touch or allow metal objects, such as coins or key rings, to contact or short-circuit in the battery terminals. Never puncture the surface of the battery with sharp objects.

Connection to a Car

Seek professional advice when connecting a phone interface to the vehicle electrical system.

Faulty and Damaged Products

Do not attempt to disassemble the phone or its accessories. Only qualified personnel can service or repair the phone or its accessories. If your phone (or its accessories) has been submerged in water, punctured, or subjected to a severe fall, do not use it until you have taken it to be checked at an authorized service center.

CTIA Requirements

- Do not disassemble or crush, bend or deform, puncture, or shred.
- Do not modify or remanufacture, attempt to insert foreign objects into the battery, immerse or expose

to water or other liquids, expose to fire, explosion or other hazard

- Only use the battery for the system for which it is specified.

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 15 cm be maintained between a mobile phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. To achieve this, use the phone on the opposite ear to your pacemaker and do not carry it in a breast pocket.

Hearing Aids

People with hearing aids or other cochlear implants may experience interfering noises when using wireless devices or when one is nearby. The level of interference will depend on the type of hearing device and the distance from the interference source. Increasing the separation between them may reduce the interference. You may also consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Medical Devices

Please consult your doctor and the device manufacturer to determine if operation of your phone may interfere with the operation of your medical device.

Hospitals

Turn off your wireless device when requested to do so in hospitals, clinics or health care facilities. These requests are designed to prevent possible interference with sensitive medical equipment.

Aircraft

Turn off your wireless device whenever you are instructed to do so by airport or airline staff. Consult the airline staff about the use of wireless devices onboard the aircraft. If your device offers a 'flight mode', this must be enabled prior to boarding an aircraft.

Interference in Cars

Please note that because of possible interference with electronic equipment, some vehicle manufacturers forbid the use of mobile phones in their vehicles unless a hands-free kit with an external antenna is included in the installation

Explosive Environments

Gas Stations and Explosive Atmospheres

In locations with potentially explosive atmospheres, obey all posted signs to turn off wireless devices such as your phone or other radio equipment. Areas with potentially explosive atmospheres include fueling areas, below decks on boats, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities, areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders.

Blasting Caps and Areas

Power off your mobile phone or wireless device when in a blasting area or in areas posted power off "two-way radios" or "electronic devices" to avoid interfering with blasting operations.
