Installing the Nano-SIM Card and microSDXC Card

Charging the Battery

Your phone's battery should have enough power for the phone to turn on, find a signal, and make a few calls. You should fully charge the battery as soon as possible.

Using Your Fingerprint

With the fingerprint sensor on the back of your phone, you can register up to five fingerprints and use them to unlock the phone, or simply press the fingerprint sensor to open a selected app, take photos, or answer calls.

Note: The fingerprint feature is available only when a screen lock (Pattern, PIN, or Password) is enabled. When the screen lock is reset to None or Long press, all registered fingerprints are erased.

Registering a Fingerprint

- From the home screen, tap (iii) > Settings > Security > Fingerprint.
- Enter the screen lock pattern, PIN, or password you set. If you haven't set a screen lock, follow the prompts to set it.
- Tap REGISTER or Fingerprint > Add fingerprint.
- 4. Follow the prompts to record the center and edges of a finger.
 - 5. Tap **OK**.

Note: Tap an existing fingerprint record to change its name or delete it.

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Setting Fingerprint Actions

 - Take photo: When the Camera app is open, press the fingerprint sensor to take a photo. No fingerprint verification is needed.
- **Answer call:** Press the fingerprint sensor to answer incoming calls. No fingerprint verification is needed.
